DELAWARE TRIBE SIGNS DEAL TO ACQUIRE TULSA COMPANY

Bartlesville, Okla – The power is out and all systems are down...no lights, no air, no heat, no refrigeration or television, no computer.....a black out and nothing electrical functions. Who you gonna call??? Of course, PSO is the logical answer, however, not the only answer. For major corporations with mega data centers, hospitals, critical care and emergency medical facilities, nursing homes, city and county municipal utility systems that can not afford to be down due to an electrical power outage, the Bartlesville based Delaware Tribe of Indians is now on call to keep electrical power systems up and running through the sales, service and maintenance of back-up electrical power generating equipment. Preventing the loss of electrical service through back-up power generation systems is now the business of the Delaware Tribe of Indians.

The Delaware Tribe of Indians, on January 10, 2008, signed a contract to purchase a Tulsa, Oklahoma, based company; Service and Equipment International, Inc. The company specializes in the sale, service, maintenance and rental of back-up Electrical Power Generation Systems. The Delaware Tribe through the Tribal holding company, The Delaware Enterprise Authority, (DEA), envisions the SEI acquisition as a niche business in a niche market. The Tribal Economic Authority expansion and marketing plan for Service and Equipment International includes the national Indian casino market, city, state, and federal facilities that must function under any and all conditions and circumstances, specifically Homeland Security and Federal Emergency Management facilities and projects. The Tribe also has plans to establish an emergency generator rental fleet to respond to natural disasters and national emergencies.

Service and Equipment specializes in diesel engine and electrical generator rebuild and repair and the Tribe has plans to establish a relationship with the Department of Defense to rebuild and repair military vehicles and equipment.

According to Delaware Enterprise Authority Vice President, Wayne Stull, “We have been working on acquiring this business from the owners, Don and Renae Musick and developing a long range business development plan for a little more than a year, and the potential for this business as a tribal enterprise is phenomenal.” “SEI can provide alternate back-up power systems for every conceivable application where electrical power is needed from the oil field, to residential, to the battle field.” Stull and Delaware Enterprise Authority President, Jerry Douglas are in agreement “that the only thing that would possibly exceed the Delaware acquisition of SEI would be for Congress to introduce and approve legislation to restore the Delaware Tribe’s federal recognition.”

According to Jerry Douglas, who is also Chief of the Tribe, “We can not continue to keep our Tribe’s Economic Development program on hold while we wait for our federal recognition to be restored.” “We have got to be able to move when opportunities are available, and acquiring SEI is a great opportunity and a good company. This is going to be a great company.....a great Delaware company.”
